Hermann showcase his class during opening day of Khaya Majola Week

Ronan Hermann, opening batsman of Gauteng, showcased his class during the opening day of the Khaya Majola Week in Potchefstroom by carrying his bat while getting his week off in the best possible way with a century.

Hermann (152*) helped his side reach 296/4 in their allotted 50 overs against Boland which was by far the highest total during the opening day of the 2021-edition of the tournament. He was dropped at the boundary on 95 and made Boland pay even further after that.

His performance was even more impressive if you factor in that Boland won the toss in overcast conditions and decided to send Gauteng in to bat first.

He was supported well by Richard Seletswane (56) and Khaya Fakude (49). Boland only managed 122 runs in return with their captain, Gysbert Wege (34) leading the charge. The pick of Gauteng's bowling attack was Sava Komal who dismissed four batsmen for only 23 runs.

On the JB Marks Oval, the hosts North West came out on top in a closely contested encounter against Eastern Province. The latter batted first and reached 248/8 thanks to half-centuries from Cormey van der Watt (56) and Casey Keevy.

Corné Prinsloo caused the most damage with the ball for North West as he picked up three wickets at the cost of 29 runs. He is the son of North West Dragons' CEO, HP Prinsloo.

North West reached the winning target with 16 deliveries to spare and four wickets in hand. Hanro Swanepoel (31*) and Rico Fryer (30*) saw their team home after Waldo Kemp (80), Bathabile Masigo (44), and Prinsloo (35) laid a solid platform.

The best bowling performance of the opening day belonged to Titans' spin bowler Schalk Engelbrecht who removed four batsmen for only 19 runs as his side restricted KwaZulu-Natal to a mere 109 runs.

The Titans however had to work hard for their three-wicket victory with Modise Maloka (34) top scoring. The side definitely missed the presence of Hardus Coetzer in their batting line-up. Coetzer was called up to the South Africa u19 squad for the World Cup in the West Indies early next year.

An 81-run unbeaten partnership between Bongile Mfunelwa (45*) and captain, Michael Levitt (36*), saw Western Province home by five wickets against Free State. Their side was in trouble after stumbling to 30/5 chasing a mere 110 runs for victory.

The Invitation XI managed to secure a victory after being bowled out for 147 runs against South Western Districts. Thurstin Murphy (4/22) caused them trouble with his bowling.

South Western Districts could only score 83 runs in return with JP King (3/6) and Reo Rammutla (2/6) being the pick of the bowlers.
