

# Weighting Of Competitions

## Men's Sunday Cricket

The overall winner will be determined by weighting the results of the competitions the club is involved in.

Premier League A & B cricket comprises of three competitions: 50 overs, Black Widow T20, Time cricket.

### Premier A

**50 Overs:** Positions are determined firstly by points, then we refer to the methodology prescribed in the bylaws to determine positions. 9 games

**Black Widow T20:** The winner, and losing finalist are positions 1 and 2. The losing semi-finalists are positions 3 and 4, and their hierarchy will be determined by their collective nett run rate in the group stages and semi-final. For those finishing outside of the top four, the groups will be merged and points will determine the positions in an overall log. Where teams finish on equal points, we will then refer to the methodology prescribed in the by-laws to determine positions. Minimum 6 games.

**Time cricket:** Positions are determined firstly by points, then we refer to the methodology prescribed in the bylaws to determine positions. 9 games

Once these have been finalised the overall winner will be determined based on the following matrix of ranking points. On average there are 25 games across the three formats with 50 overs 9 games, Time cricket 9 games and BWT20 7 games.

The winner of the 50 Over competition represents CGL at National Club Champs on the premise that they have met CSA transformation criteria in all games of that competition i.e., played 2 players of colour with 1 being a black South African.

The winner of the BWT20 A division represents CGL at CSA Community Cup on the premise that they are a community club and have met the CSA transformation criteria in all games of that competition i.e., played 2 players of colour with 1 being black South African.

(In the event of the final of the BWT20 being between 2 universities, and the losing semi-finalists having both met the CSA transformation criteria, a play-off game will be held between the two losing semi-finalists to determine the CGL Community Cup entrant. If the BWT20 is between a community club and a university, the community club would represent CGL at the CSA Community Cup on the proviso that they had met the CSA transformation criteria through the competition.)

**The teams finishing in 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> place are relegated to Premier B (for 2023/24 and 2024/25 – this will get league to a manageable 12 team league again). THERE IS NO PROTECTION FOR ANY TEAMS.**

### **Premier B**

**50 Overs:** Positions are determined firstly by points, then we refer to the methodology prescribed in the bylaws to determine positions. 9 games

**Black Widow T20:** The winner, and losing finalist are positions 1 and 2. The losing semi-finalists are positions 3 and 4, and their hierarchy will be determined by nett run rate in the group stages and semi-final. With the groups having 7 and 6 teams, the larger group will have their points divided by 6 and multiplied by 5. This will give a point ranking for the teams; the groups will be then merged and points will determine the positions for those outside of the semi-finalists. Where teams finish on equal points, we will then refer to the methodology prescribed in the by-laws to determine positions.

**Time cricket:** Positions are determined firstly by points, then we refer to the methodology prescribed in the bylaws to determine positions. 9 games

Once these have been finalised the overall winner will be determined based on the following matrix of ranking points. On average there are 25 games across the three formats with 50 overs 9 games, Time cricket 9 games and BWT20 7 games, the ranking points are allocated accordingly (rounded up).

The overall winner is promoted (unless it is a 2<sup>nd</sup> team, then the next eligible side is promoted) and the teams in overall 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> are relegated to Presidents A (for 2023/24, 2024/25 or until league is back to 12 teams). The last placed 2<sup>nd</sup> XI will also be relegated (if not in the last two spots) as there is an agreed cap on 2<sup>nd</sup> XI's in Premier B and the winner of Premier A will replace them. THERE IS NO PROTECTION FOR ANY TEAMS.

**Presidents A and B**

President’s League cricket comprises of two competitions: 50 overs and Time cricket.

**50 Overs:** Positions are determined firstly by points, then we refer to the methodology prescribed in the bylaws to determine positions. 12 games

**Time cricket:** Positions are determined firstly by points, then we refer to the methodology prescribed in the bylaws to determine positions. 12 games

Once these have been finalised the overall winner will be determined based on the following matrix of ranking points.

The overall winner is promoted (unless the club has a team in Premier B, then the next eligible team is promoted) and the teams in overall 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> are relegated to Presidents B/SU1 (for 2023/24, 2024/25 or until league is back to manageable 12 teams). THERE IS NO PROTECTION FOR ANY TEAMS.

In the event of any team being relegated into a lower league and that club having a side in the lower league, that lower team is also relegated as clubs are only allowed one team per league.

# Women's Saturday Cricket

## Premier League

The overall winner will be determined by weighting the results of the competitions the club is involved in.

Women's cricket comprises of two competitions: 35 overs and Time cricket.

**35 Overs:** Positions are determined firstly by points, then we refer to the methodology prescribed in the bylaws to determine positions. 10 games

**Black Widow T20:** The winner, and losing finalist are positions 1 and 2. The losing semi-finalists are positions 3 and 4, and their hierarchy will be determined by the combined nett run rate in the group stages and semi-finals. The groups will be then merged, and the premier teams are separated from Presidents teams. Points will determine the positions for those outside of the semi-finalists. Where teams finish on equal points, we will then refer to the methodology prescribed in the by-laws to determine positions.

Once these have been finalised the overall winner will be determined based on the following matrix of ranking points. With 15 games across the two formats and 35 overs being 10 games and BWT20 5 games, the ranking points are similarly allocated.

The groups will be then merged, and the premier teams are separated from presidents' teams. Points will determine the positions for those outside of the semi-finalists. Once these have been finalised the overall winner will be determined based on the following matrix of ranking points. With 15 games across the two formats and 35 overs being 10 games and BWT20 5 games, the ranking points are similarly allocated.
